# WHY PLAY??

#### THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF DEVELOPMENT

Block play is when children use building blocks of various shapes, sizes, and materials to construct structures, create patterns, or simply explore.

#### SUPPORTS SPATIAL SKILLS

Figuring out how blocks fit together and creating 2D and 3D designs helps children visualize shapes, sizes, and spatial relationships – abilities linked to math and science achievement later on.



## STRENGTHENS EXECUTIVE FUNCTION

The trial and error, planning and problem-solving involved in block play exercises skills like working memory, focused attention, and cognitive flexibility.

# BOOSTS DEVELOPMENT OF CONCEPTS

Block structures like bridges, tunnels and enclosures help children grasp abstract concepts like support, balance, stability, and enclosure.



## PROMOTES CREATIVITY AND IMAGINATION

Through block play children often engage in make-believe situations, enriching their storytelling capabilities and stimulating imaginative thinking.



## ENCOURAGES TURN-TAKING AND COOPERATION

Building projects with others teaches social skills like sharing, negotiation, and compromise from a young age.



Block play is a pivotal activity fostering cognitive and social enhancement. Every moment your child spends engrossed in their block creations, they're also building critical skills for their future


