

WHY WE PLAY



When you see children playing, have you ever noticed how often they fail? Towers crash down, invented games fall apart, feelings and knees may get bruised.

When children are engrossed in something they've chosen and directed, you don't have to explain to them the value of grit.

Motivation and reward are partners with play.









Children need resilience, the ability to bounce back from setbacks. They need to have the confidence and the coping skills to handle defeat and disappointment. Not one of those elements sounds fun on its own, but they all happen naturally in play.

Research psychologist Angela Duckworth found that across many different fields, the most **successful** applicants were not those who had the highest IQs, but those who were **persistent** and who **persevered** in spite of difficulties and frustration.

In a safe environment where children can calculate risk, take chances, fail, and try again, children will learn from their mistakes. They learn how to adjust, compensate, and make informed decisions. They learn how to stick with something they're passionate about, even when it's hard or frustrating.
