### **WHY WE PLAY**

At The Sensory Table

The sensory table is a powerhouse for learning. That bin of sand, seeds, or sawdust is more than just another way to keep kids busy; it's a bustling factory of developmental growth. In addition to honing sensory and science knowledge, sensory play builds language and social skills as children negotiate with one another to share tools and create stories.









Children are wired to receive and utilize sensory input from day one. This is why children will dive in, hands first, exploring a new substance. The senses are their most familiar, most basic way to explore, process, and come to understand new information. Along the way, they are also building neurological pathways. With each experience, their sensory intake and

processing become more acute. As they are better able to use their senses, they are then better able to learn through their senses. Sensory play is really part of the scientific process. They use their senses to collect data and from that, attempt to answer their own questions. This is a valid scientific inquiry, and all real learning begins with inquiry!
